


BLACK & GOLD GALA RECOGNIZES TECH LEGENDS —*MONSIGNOR JEREMIAH MURPHY* (8/19/37-3/1/17)

Monsignor Jeremiah Murphy's contributions to Bosco Tech and the Los Angeles community are extensive and lasting. He selflessly gave his time, wisdom and spiritual guidance to Bosco Tech for 41 years as a faithful member of the school's Board of Trustees. His contributions to the Tech, St. Paul's High School, St. Brendan Church, the Dan Murphy Foundation, St. Victor's Parish, and countless other charities are a lasting blessing to the community, and we are grateful for his commitment and his legacy.

A Los Angeles native born in 1937, Monsignor Murphy graduated from Transfiguration School and was ordained a priest of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles after completing his studies at St. John's Seminary in 1963. After ordination, he taught at St. Paul High School; was Principal of Bishop Amat High School; and served as Superintendent of High Schools and Colleges for the Archdiocese of



Los Angeles. Named a monsignor in 1978, he served as archdiocese secretariat director and pastor of Hancock Park's St. Brendan Church. He was named administrator of St. Victor Catholic Church in West Hollywood, and was appointed parish pastor in 2003 where he served until his death. Monsignor Murphy also served on several philanthropic boards including the Dan Murphy Foundation and Junipero Serra High School, in addition to his trustee responsibilities at Bosco Tech. He also founded the McIntyre House, a non-profit substance abuse recovery home for men.

Monsignor Murphy obtained Master's degrees in Science, Arts and Religious Studies from Mount Saint Mary's University; a Master's of Business Administration and Doctorate of Education from Pepperdine University; and a Doctorate of Philosophy from the University of Southern California.

"He was an asset to the Bosco Tech board of trustees and a friend to the school for many, many years," said Bosco Tech Principal Xavier Jimenez at the news of Monsignor Murphy's death in 2017. "Our hearts are saddened at the passing of this great man who faithfully carried out his vocation to minister to others. His presence will be greatly missed."

In 2018, the Monsignor Jeremiah T. Murphy Endowment was established at Bosco Tech with a lead gift of \$100,000 from the Daniel Murphy Foundation. The endowment helps realize the Tech's unwavering commitment to serving bright and talented young men from poor and disadvantaged communities and serve as a means to fortify the school's scholarship fund.

Paying tribute to Monsignor Murphy's memory, Monsignor Gregory A. Cox, the Executive Director of Catholic Charities, said, "Even though Monsignor Murphy was blessed with many spiritual and intellectual gifts, his humility helped him maintain his spirit of service to God and others."
